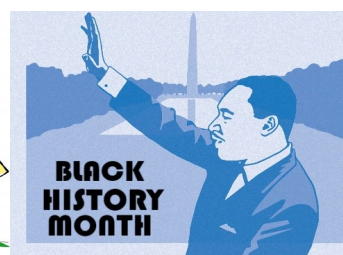
Fleetwood Safe Graduation

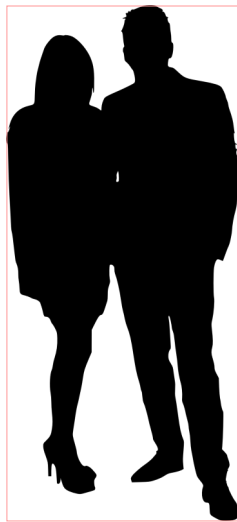
